Everyone deserves to be treated kindly and with respect...

Abuse can be difficult to talk about, but you are not alone. Talk to someone you trust. It could be a

- family member
- friend
- neighbour
- pastor
- doctor
- home support worker
- nurse
- lawyer
- bank employee

Or call 211 to speak to someone who can help.

We can help by...

- Responding to concerns about elder abuse
- Making contact with victims of elder abuse and arranging a safe, confidential visit
- Assessing risk and making a safety plan
- Assisting with determining needs and setting goals
- Providing emotional support
- Consulting with partnering support agencies
- Following up to ensure continued safety and connection to community

If you are being abused...

- Call 911 if you are in danger
- Call 211 to get information on how to get help in your community
- Pick a safe time and place to call or talk to someone you trust
- Explain that you want someone to help you
- Reach out - the solution might be easier than you think

If someone you know is being abused...

- Call 911 if they are in danger
- Call 211 for information, or for confidential assistance
- Ask the person if they are okay
- Don't jump to conclusions, but ask questions
- Tell them you are there for them
- Don't confront or accuse the abusive person
- Call one of the Local Resources listed in this brochure to ask for help
