Name of Nominee: Moving Edson (Edson Seniors Transportation Society)

Why are they a "Community Builder?":

Name of Nominee: Yellowhead Agricultural Society

Why are they a "Community Builder?":

The YAS has been in operation since 1975. Since this time, the society has provided endless recreation, education and entertainment opportunities for the Edson and surrounding areas. The society and events are all put on by volunteers who regularly contribute over 5000 hours collectively each year to the success of the YAS and community involvement. Why are they a "Community Builder?":

The Heart of Edson has truly become the heart of arts and culture in Edson. In addition to providing a place for local artists and artisans to display and sell their work, Jayne and Julian have created a space where regional and touring musicians come to perform. Their concert series is the main reason I am nominating them for a Community Builder award.

Since August 2021, the gallery has hosted 10 concerts that have been attended by people of all ages from Edson and area. Jayne and Julian do the ticket sales, setup & teardown--everything that goes into presenting a concert-for free. All the money taken in through tickets goes to the performers. I recall talking to Julian about the first concert with Scott Cook & The Indoorables. He found an album by Scott that he really liked and was motivated to try presenting a concert behind the main gallery space. Jayne & Julian collected furniture, tracked down a small stage, set up lights. That first show was a great success, and Julian was motivated to connect with more artists and present more shows. Jayne & Julian even renovated their building to enhance the comfort of performers and audience. They started out with one bathroom but have now added four bathrooms plus a Green Room (artist) space, improving the experience for musicians and audience. They have invested in their business as a place for people to come together and celebrate the performing and visual arts.

Name of Nominee: Girl Guides of Canada- Edson

Why are they a "Community Builder?":

Building up girls, creating new, fun experiences, giving girls the opportunity to challenge themselves, Girl Guides are more than just cookies!
